SPECIAL PERMIT AND LICENSE BOARD MINUTES OF IN-PERSON MEETING WEDNESDAY, JUNE 5, 2024

Answering to roll call were Chairperson Brown, Board members Amin, Magill, McCullough, Moe and Rommelfanger. Absent was Hatfield. Staff present included Mary Joy Barajas, Assistant City Clerk, Liquor Enforcement Officer Troy Gordanier and Chuck Piekarski, Assistant City Attorney.

APPROVAL OF MINUTES

The minutes of the May 15, 2024, meeting was accepted into the record. Chair Brown excused member Moe for her absence. Member Amin was marked as an unexcused absence for the May 15, 2024, meeting, Chair Brown asked for the absence to be marked as excused due to explanation.

NEW OP LIQUOR LICENSE FOR PICKLEBALL FOOD PUB

Item was tabled due a location posting error. Item will be rescheduled for June 19th regular meeting.

NEW TAVERN LIQUOR LICENSE FOR SCRATCH GOLF

Chair Brown opened a public hearing to consider a new tavern liquor license application from Scratch Golf LLC, dba Scratch Golf, 8700 West 101st Ave #100. Barajas reported that the application was complete and all legal notice requirements had been satisfied.

Liquor Enforcement Officer Gordanier stated the background check was completed and nothing was found, funding appeared proper, registered manager didn't appear to have alcohol experience. The Police department finds no reason to deny the application.

William Tucker, owner, was sworn in. Adam Stapen, attorney lead Tucker through questions concerning the new tavern application. Tucker provided background on his and the other three long term friend's work experience and the desire to open a tavern where golf and other sporting events could be watched, and the ability to take golf lessons in the simulator. The desire is for upscale finishes the intent to be open Monday thru Sunday from 9 am to 10 pm. Will be hiring an experienced tavern manager and will start with 3-4 employees. Tucker has attended responsible vendor training and new manager and staff will be responsible vendor trained. Food available will be standard snacks and items that can be heated. No vertical ID's will be accepted, everyone will be ID'd and one alcohol drink to be served for each ID checked. Wanted a location that was located at major intersections and in close proximity to golf courses. The survey completed by Oedipus Petitioning reflected a 95% needs and desires outcome and was entered into the record. Brown seeing no persons present or additional questions closed the public hearing at 7:21 p.m.

Based on the testimony and evidence provided, McCullough made a motion, seconded by Moe to approve the tavern liquor license from Scratch Golf LLC, dba Scratch Golf, 8700 West 101st Ave #100 based on finding that the application was complete, the hearing was properly posted and advertised, the premise was located in an area where the sale of alcoholic beverages for on-premise consumption is allowed, there are three

other tavern liquor licenses within the designated neighborhood, there has not been a tavern liquor license denied at this location or within 500 feet of it within the preceding two years, and the applicant was of good character based on the report provided by the Westminster Police Department. In addition, the applicant was licensed to do business in Colorado and the desires of the inhabitants of the designated neighborhood indicated there was no objection to the use based on the results of the survey. The motion carried with a 6-0 vote.

Barajas introduced Kate Behan, Asst City Clerk to the Board. Barajas reported that there are items scheduled for the June 19^{TH} and July 3^{rd} regular meetings.

Subject: Public Hearing to consider the tavern liquor license application for lup Westminster

Hold a public hearing for Board to consider a tavern liquor license application from Chinatown Fair in the Rockies LLC dba The 1up Westminster, 4750 W 120th Ave, Suite 900. The property is zoned PUD (Planned Unit Development) and the sale of alcoholic beverages by the drink for on-premises consumption is an allowed use. Notice of this hearing was published on the Westminster website on June 6th and the property has been posted with signage to notify passersby of the date and time of this hearing for more than the ten days preceding this hearing.

The designated neighborhood boundaries for petitioning purposes were North: W 124th Ave; South: W 116th Way; West: Chase Street; East: Lowell Blvd. Surveying was completed by Liquor Pros Petitioning, and the report of results together with a map showing where petitioning was conducted, and the signed petitions are attached.

There currently is one tavern licenses in this neighborhood located in Broomfield - The Old Man.

A report from the Westminster Police Department regarding the results of the investigation on the applicant is attached. Troy Gordanier, Liquor Investigations Officer, will be present to review those findings with the Board.

Staff Recommendation

Conduct a public hearing and, by motion, direct the City Attorney's office to prepare findings of fact based on the testimony received addressing applicable criteria for the tavern liquor license application from Chinatown Fair in the Rockies LLC dba The Jup Westminster, 4750 W 120th Ave, Suite 900.

Prior to the start of the survey, the circulator was briefed on the type of liquor license application, the areas to be surveyed and reminded to remain unbiased in his approach to residents and businesspeople. The circulator had with them a face sheet with the applicant business name, location and hearing information, instructions, and the petition/survey issue along with signature sheets, mail in forms and a map of the proposed location. The circulator used tally sheets to record all contacts, attempts and reasons for opposition signatures and refusals. At the conclusion of the survey, the circulator signed notarized affidavits of circulation. The original survey packets were pre-filed with the Westminster City Clerk's Office.







Remove this tabled item and hold a public hearing to consider an option premises liquor license application from APA NW Denver LLC, dba Pickleball Food Pub, 7647 W 88th Avenue. The property is zoned PUD (Planned Unit Development) and the sale of alcoholic beverages by the drink for onpremises consumption is an allowed use. Notice of this hearing was published on the City's website on May 23rd and the property has been posted with signage to notify passersby of the date and time of this hearing for more than the ten days preceding this hearing.

The designated neighborhood boundaries for petitioning purposes were: North: 93rd Ave extended, the 9300 block north; South: 84th Ave extended, the 8400 block north; West: Pierce Street extended, the 6800-block west; East: Yates Street extended, the 5000-block west. - 2. The contractors carried a clipboard with the following:
 - A. Maps and cover pages of the area denoting the proposed location of the license and the boundaries of the defined neighborhood;
 - B. Petition signature pages allowing individuals contacted to indicate their opinion; and
 - C. A statistics sheet to record the opinion of those not signing and not-at-homes.
- 3. Business and residential petitioning was conducted on May 27 and 28, 2024, within the designated area prescribed by the City of Westminster (see maps). The circulation packets have cover maps, and the areas in which each petition circulation/polling took place are outlined in highlighter. Included in this Report is a master circulation map outlining all areas where circulation/polling was conducted.
- 4. Individuals who were available in areas not posted as "No Soliciting, Private Property/No Trespassing" were contacted on a random sampling basis, were screened to identify them as parties in interest, and were asked their opinion after they had been informed of the applicant, site location, and type of license being applied for. Their opinion was either recorded on the petition format or on the statistics sheet.
- 5. Two (2) petition packets (one packet representing businesses and one packet representing residences) were pre-filed electronically and delivered with this Report on May 29, 2024, to Mary Joy Barajas, Deputy City Clerk to comply with the pre-filing deadline.







Pursuant to W.M.C. § 5-14-10(D), prior to issuing special events permits, the Board must consider, in addition to the eligibility of the applicants, whether issuance of the permit would be injurious to the public welfare due to the nature of the special event, its location within the community, or the failure of the applicants in a past special event to conduct the event in compliance with applicable laws and regulations.

Staff Recommendation

Westminster Recreation and Libraries Department for three special events permits: July 4th event from 8:00 a.m. to 11:00 p.m.; Westy Brew Fest on July 27th from noon to 10:00 p.m.; Westy Fest on October 27th at from noon to 10:00 p.m., all taking place at the City Park soccer complex, 10455 Sheridan Boulevard.

This purpose of this document is to clearly define the Security and Service Plan for alcohol service scheduled to take place on conjunction 4th of July Celebration, July 4, 2024.

Security

- PRL will request two City of Westminster uniformed police officer to serve as security for liquor service.
- Officer and city staff will be responsible for ensuring alcoholic beverages do not leave the event area, as well as provide on-site security including monitoring guests consuming alcohol for legal age and signs of intoxication.

Service Plan

- Alcohol will be served between the hours of 4 pm 9:30 pm on July 4, 2024.
- Service will be extended to include the City Park Soccer Complex. The service areas will be monitored by staff and uniformed police officers.
- "No Alcohol Beyond This Point" will be placed around the complex area.





City of Westminster Parks and Recreation Westy Fest Security & Service Plan

This purpose of this document is to clearly define the Security and Service Plan for alcohol service scheduled to take place on conjunction at Westy Fest on, October 19, 2024.

Security

- PRL will request a City of Westminster uniformed police officer to serve as security for liquor service.
- Officer and city staff will be responsible for ensuring alcoholic beverages do not leave the event
 area, as well as provide on-site security including monitoring guests consuming alcohol for legal
 age and signs of intoxication.
- Events staff will assign a liquor vendor manager who will monitor alcohol vendors through the event.

Service Plan


- Alcohol will be served between the hours of 12 pm 8 pm on October 21, 2023.
- Service will be extended to include the City Park Soccer Complex. The service areas will be monitored by staff and uniformed police officers.
- "No Alcohol Beyond This Point" will be placed around the complex area.
- Kokopelli, Bruz, and Chuys will provide liquor and responsible service trained staffing for the
 event.
- There will be between 10-16 brewery staff and Westminster Police Officers at the service throughout the service times of 12-8 pm.
- Liquor Vendors certified in Alcohol Service Training will be checking IDs and serving alcohol during the event.
- All guests will be required to show proper ID prior to purchasing alcohol.
- Once an ID has been verified, guests will receive a brightly colored wrist band to be worn on their right hand.
- Guest will have their wrist bands marked an X for each purchase to control consumption.
 Attendees may consume up to 3 drinks during the event.
- Alcohol served will be poured into a standard r.cup brand cup to help identify drinks served by the event.

Special Events Alcohol and Drug Policy Statement (taken from the event safety plan)

Start, contractors and volunteers (including volunteer teams) are not allowed to consume alcohol
while on duty. Any staff, contractor or volunteer who is intoxicated while serving in an official
capacity for the festival will not be allowed to continue.
☐ Volunteers may not consume or be under the influence of alcohol, marijuana (smoke or edible), or
other illegal drugs while wearing a volunteer T-shirt or other credentials associated with the City of
Westminster. Volunteers may join the party after their volunteer shift is concluded. If a volunteer
leaves her/his shift to enjoy the event and alcohol, they must remove their volunteer T-shirt.

☐ Any volunteer caught consuming alcohol while volunteering will be asked to leave the booth and
not return.
☐ City and state law prohibit smoking marijuana in public places.
☐ City of Westminster staff and contractors are dedicated to allowing alcohol consumption in a safe
and responsible manner. Staff, all volunteers, and contractors are obligated to follow all city and state
laws when it comes to alcohol. No underage drinking is allowed. Anyone consuming alcohol must be
able to provide a valid picture ID whenever it is requested.
☐ All event guests will submit photo IDs to be checked by Bender's staff and will receive a wristband
to validate that they are of legal drinking age.
☐ All volunteers, contractors, and staff who are involved in serving alcohol are required to be
familiar with the principals of TIPS Training. TIPS (Training for Intervention Procedures) is a
nationally recognized program designed to prevent intoxication, prevent drunk driving and prevent
underage drinking.
☐ Attendees will have their wristbands marked when purchasing a drink. Attendees are limited to 3
drinks during the event.
Tips Training Reminders / Basic Server Information
As servers of alcohol, your job is to provide enjoyment for event attendees as well as ensure a safe
environment at the event. The following information highlights the formal program developed for
restaurants and bar employees called TIPS (Training for Intervention Procedures by Servers of
Alcohol):
☐ The average 150-pound man will exceed the "legally impaired" level of alcohol in the bloodstream
(.08) by drinking four 12-ounce beers within one hour. Women will generally have a higher level of
alcohol because they have a higher % of body fat vs muscle (body fat does not absorb alcohol).
☐ Many things can factor in including rate of drinking, strength of the drink, height, weight, size and
physical condition, stress and/or exhaustion level, medication and other drugs in the bloodstream.
In trying to determine whether or not an individual is intoxicated, a server should observe the
individual's behavioral clues.
Look for:
☐ Loss of inhibitions (talks too loud, gets unusually exuberant or moody)
☐ Loss of judgment (inappropriate behavior, foul language, irrational comments, impulsive acts,
extreme anger, grabbing beer, throwing cup)
☐ Impaired reactions (slurred speech, sleepy/bloodshot eyes, loss of train of thought)
☐ Hampered coordination (loss of balance, spilling, sloppiness, dropping beer)
☐ If a guest exhibits any of the above signs of impairment and is belligerent and/or is posing a danger
to themselves or others, excuse yourself for the moment and communicate with event staff or WPD
on channel 2 for help resolving the situation.
If security is not available, then:
☐ Use a calm and firm tone of voice and suggest that the individual take a break from consuming
alcohol; suggest getting a soft drink or some food; speak directly to the point as it causes fewer
negative reactions (slow down the rate of consumption).
☐ Do not be afraid to take responsibility for your actions, such as beginning your sentences in the
first person "I" rather than the accusatory "you"; for example, "I believe you need to take a break"
rather than "You look like you have had too much to drink."
□ Provide a reason for your action in a non-threatening and nonjudgmental way since everyone
responds more positively to reasonable statements. Reasons include "It is the event's house rules not
responde mere positively to reasonable statements, reasons include it is the event s nouse rates not

to over serve" or "It is against the law to serve alcoholic beverages to someone who appears to have
been over served".
\square You do not want to have to call security - act as if you are on their side. If the individual insists on
contesting your decision to deny service, stop serving totally. Take the drink off the table. Walk
away. Do not take matters into your own hands.
