 - I. Restricted revenue: you can't spend too much on one part of the funding program and you cannot pay for something that isn't appropriate for that category (ex. parks & rec couldn't pay for a fire station)
 - III. How much land in Westminster is parks and open space
 - I. 3,800 acres of open space/parks land (15% of the city)
 - II. 36 miles of land
 - III. Other cities and states have not done as much for reserving open space and having these trails
