Downtown Westminster Art Walk

The newly emerging downtown Westminster is an area of vibrancy and community gathering spaces. The new Downtown Westminster Art Walk provide a place where community members can enjoy an regularly changing display of art.

The Fuse Box Container Art Gallery

The first installation of the Downtown Art Walk was the Fuse Box Container Art Gallery located across from the Downtown Plaza. This funky art gallery provides display and sales space for local artists. The construction of the gallery allows for viewing of art 24/7 through secure windows.

The Fuse Box was constructed by a local company and is managed and staff by the Paletteers Art Club through a contract with the City of Westminster.

The Paletteers Art Club, Inc. was formed in 1961 by a group of five local artists who met on a regular basis for painting sessions. After several months, they decided to form an art club to promote the highest standards in original works of art by artists in the community, and to encourage the practice and appreciation of fine art. The Club continues to support fellowship among its members, provide public awareness, stimulate creativity, raise standards of excellence and promote the arts in Adams County. Sculpture Walk

In 2024, the City expanded its sculpture on loan program to include three pad sites in downtown Westminster. These pads are located on Easton Street between 88th Avenue and 89th Avenue. In 2025, the City will install additional sculpture pads along 88th Avenue, Westminster Boulevard and 89th Avenue which will connect with the Fuse Box Container Art Gallery. Sculptures will be procured through the City's sculpture on loan program and change out on an annual basis. Watch for these upcoming changes!

About Reven Swanson

"Reven Marie Swanson is an accomplished sculptor installing works throughout the Rocky Mountain region and the West. She installs many temporary outdoor installations leased by city municipalities. She works closely with city officials and installation crews successfully exhibiting a dozen works each year. Recent commissions in Colorado include Trust for Public Lands, the National Endowment for the Arts, and the Museum of Outdoor Arts. Ms. Swanson's artwork is about change, movement, balance and growth. Through the artworks, Ms. Swanson seeks to explore modern culture and its relationship with the natural world. The works are often suspended or mounted above ground to imply flight, movement, and transitional experiences of growth."

From the Artist about "Blue Butterfly Swarm"

"Blue Butterfly Swarm" is constructed of reed-like uprights that support a welded steel ball made of butterflies. The ball is suspended so it moves freely. In the evening, the ball has a solar light element that softly illuminates and changes color.

“Ms. Coleman grew up in Littleton in the 60's & 70's when young women were regulated to Home Economics and barred from taking shop classes or even from major sports. But this did not stop her from digging through the garage for scraps of wood to build a fully functioning artist easel and launching her fine art career with a tenacity for new mediums. Her continued struggle for a foot in the male dominated advertising and marketing world had her create her own ad agency, after a 30-year advertising career Annette transitioned seamlessly into her fine art pursuits. Her work is in many established collections including the Children's hospital of Denver, Broomfield Library, Lakewood Civic Center, Colorado Mesa University, Broomfield Health & Services Building, the State of Colorado/Western Colorado University and Craig Hospital to name a few and most recently in Old Town Scottsdale with 'Pinball Wizard' where one of her art icons Louise Nevelson is in the same collection.
