Questions Asked

- Following the update presentation, several questions were brought up:
 - Is the scope of our advisory role mostly on the facility, or is it on all of those distinct projects?
 - o What is gravity thickener [referenced in one of the site diagrams]?
 - What's the current level of demand and how will the three facilities work together?
 - o How will phase 2 work?
 - o Is the supply line existing?
 - o Eagles are out there, so with construction, how will that work with nesting?
 - Let's assume that the only way you didn't save on the cost is because you didn't build the big facility you planned, and you've basically transported the costs in the facility when you have to build another facility in Phase 2.
